

Player Demographics, by age




1.4 million players are "core" players, having played ≥ 8 times a year.



How to Play

Pickleball can be played with **singles** or **doubles**. There is a section on each side of the net called the **non-volley zone**, or kitchen, where players cannot hit the ball out of the air. **Points can only be scored by the serving team** when the other team faults. If the serving team faults, the serve goes to the other team. Games are generally played to **11** points.


Serving



Servers stand
outside the court.
They serve
underhand,
with the paddle
below waist height.

On a serve, the ball must land in the **diagonal** court space beyond the kitchen. If a point is scored, the server **switches sides** and serves from the left.

Two-Bounce Rule



After a serve, each side must let the ball bounce once before hitting it. After these two bounces, they are allowed to hit the ball with or without it bouncing first.
